Crooklands - Stainton 6km

Allow 2 hours walking, or a mix of walking and boat trip.



PARKING

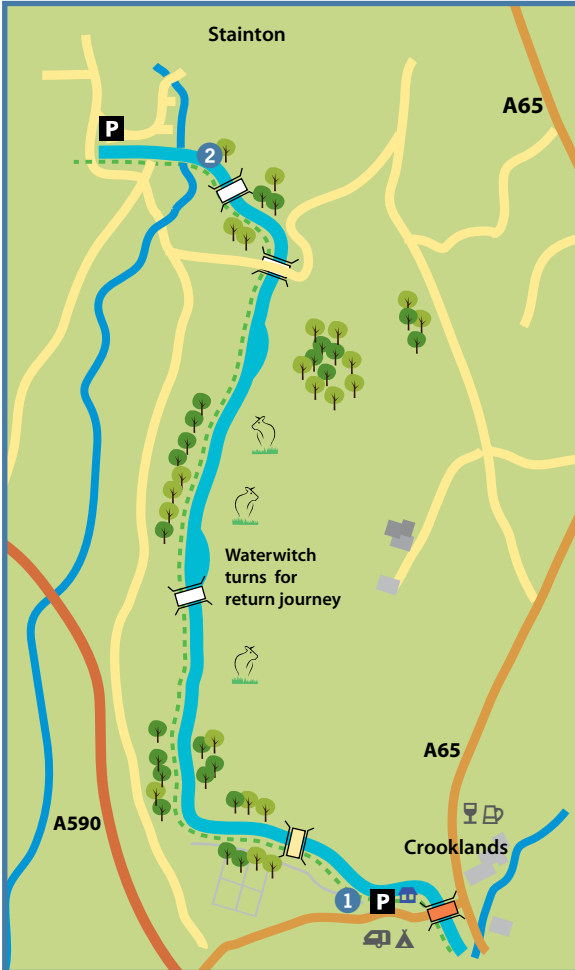
Park either at the Waterwatch jetty at Crooklands ❶, or at the end of the canal near Stainton ❷.

If walking south to north and back, you'll see the Waterwatch landing stage just across the road from the Crooklands Hotel. For Waterwatch sailing times visit www.lctrust.co.uk

Waterwatch will carry you about 1km north, and you can walk the remainder 2km to see the restoration work that's being done to restore the canal to Kendal.

This is a flat walk that's all-terrain pushchair friendly, on grassy surfaces. The round trip is about 6km.

Why not start or finish your visit with a snack and drink in the Crooklands Hotel?
