Cinderbarrow to Greenlands Farm stretch

Just under 3km walk, around 2 hours round trip.



A lovely walk, in between two picnic sites, full of natural interest, and taking in some of our canal heritage along the way. Look out for kingfishers!

PARKING Cinderbarrow Picnic Site 1

1 Leave Cinderbarrow Picnic Site, turn left into Yealand Road. Cross over the railway bridge to the Canal Bridge. (142)

You'll see a white gate with a right turn onto the towpath.

2 On the opposite bank you can just make out the overgrown stonework from the old wharf, where limestone was shipped out from Cinderbarrow Quarry.

Head south along the towpath to Cinderbarrow Culvert, where it meets the M6 3. You'll need to go through an iron gate by the culvert and join a road running parallel to the motorway. 4

Head left and southwards along here to cross the motorway bridge and join Canal Bridge 141. Turn right and join the towpath again above the top lock of the Tewitfield flight.

5 Look carefully here and you'll see a pair of original lock gates just by the tow-path -They were removed and preserved in 1942.

Many disused locks were made into weirs, so its interesting to see this pair.

The 8 locks here raised the canal an astonishing 75 feet over half a mile, and historically, swift packet boats such as 'Waterwitch' and 'Crewdson' would let passengers off to stretch their legs here and enjoy watching the locking process.

Once you're at the bottom lock, you'll also meet the A6070 flyover, and then comes out at Tewitfield Basin, which is the northern end of the navigable waterway.

6 You'll end up at Greenlands Farm which was originally a working dairy farm, now offers a taste of the countryside, cafe and shopping for all the family.


For walkers though, carry on along the towpath to Tewitfield Turnpike Bridge 138, to find a peaceful picnic area; with tables, seating and permanent barbeque for walkers and boaters.
